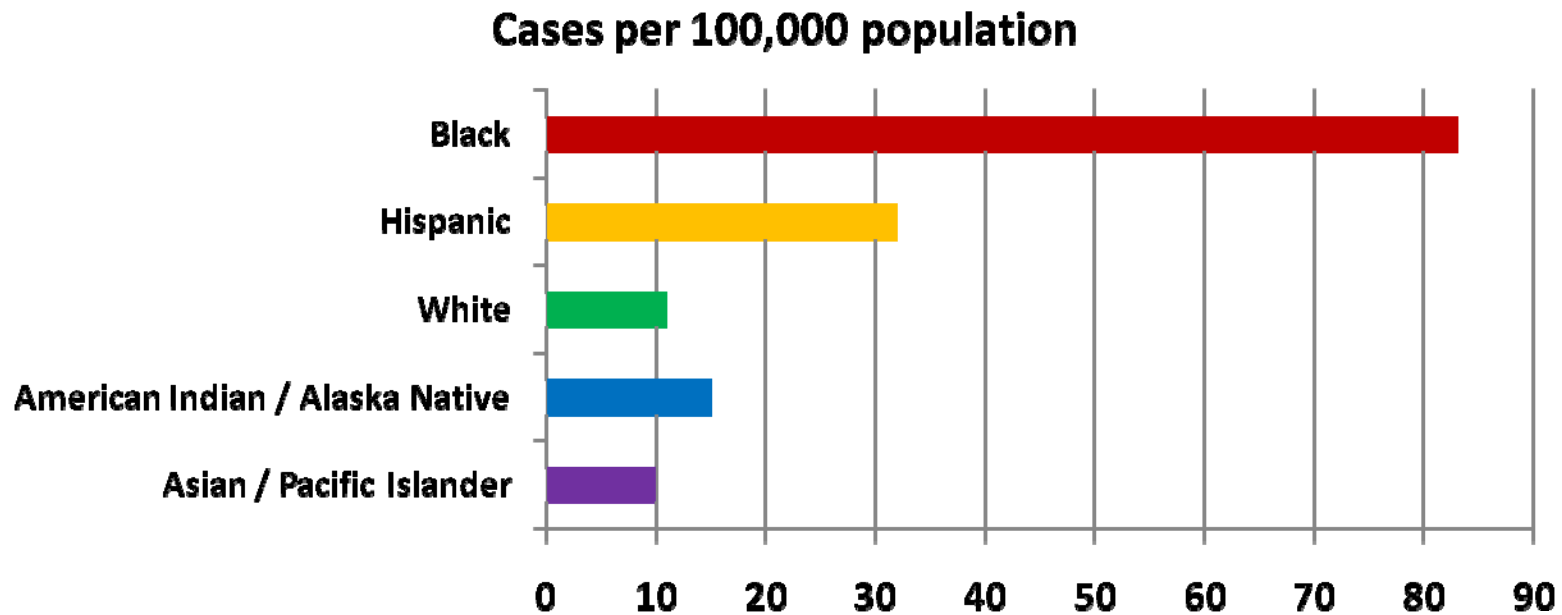
Overall Committee Goal

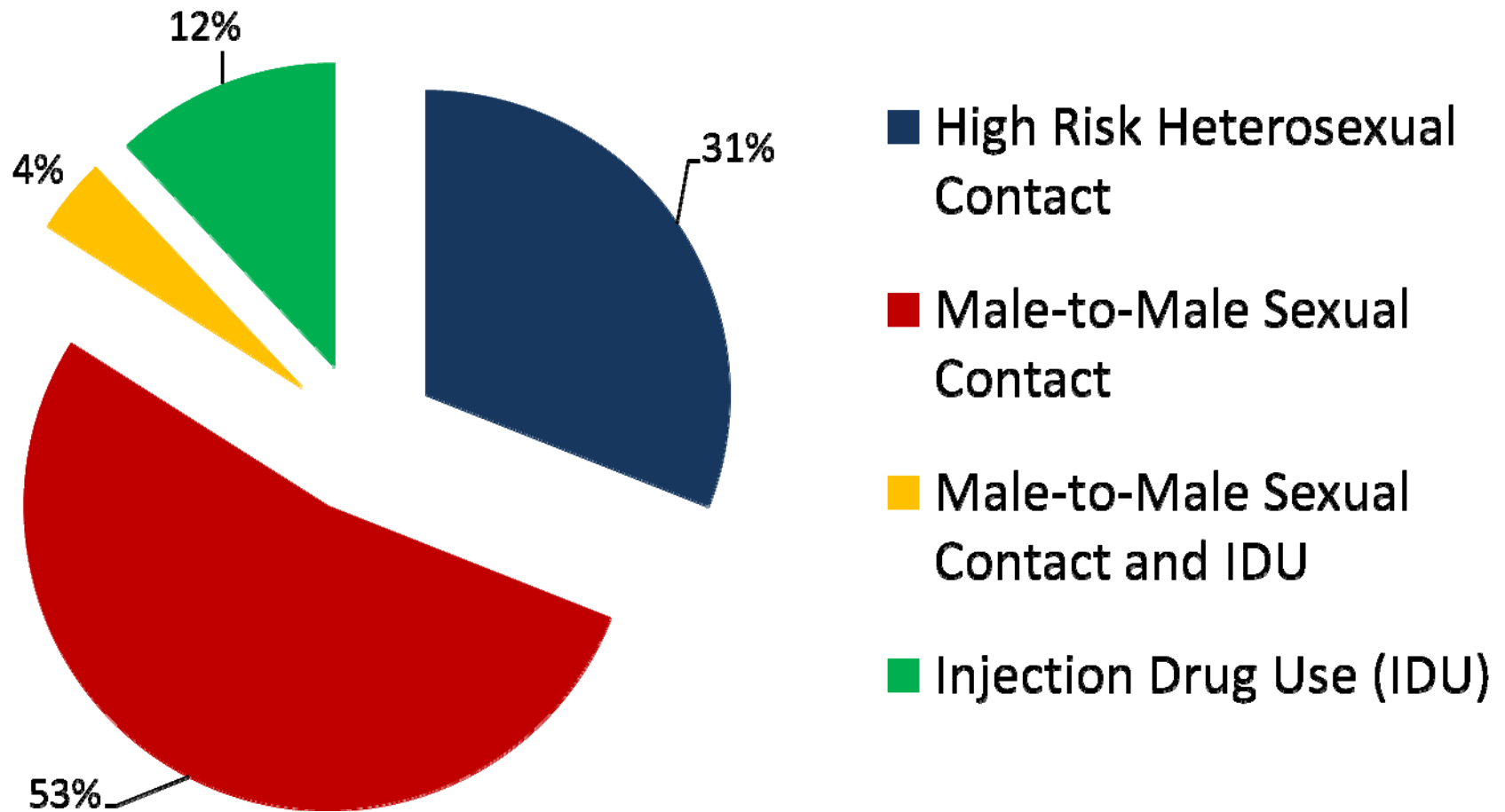

Blacks—In 2006, the rate of new infections among non-Hispanic blacks was 7 times the rate among whites (83.7 versus 11.5 new infections per 100,000 population). Blacks also accounted for the largest share of new infections (45%, or 24,900).

Hispanics—The rate of new HIV infections among Hispanics in 2006 was 3 times the rate among whites (29.3 versus 11.5 per 100,000), and Hispanics accounted for 17% of new infections (9,700).

Estimated New HIV Infections, By Transmission Category, 2006



Brainstorming

- Increased use of media based messaging through street based and online outreach.
- Increased education and outreach to community specific groups.

- Collaborations amongst existing agencies and programs.
- Increased education on health relationships and negotiating skills.
- Increased education on empowerment and self esteem.
- Patients are educated on the full spectrum of health.
